Ingham Intermediate School District Announces Board of Education Openings

Ingham Intermediate School District will be holding its biennial board member election on Monday, June 3, 2019. Two six-year terms on the Intermediate School District Board are up for election this year. The terms begin on July 1, 2019 and end on June 30, 2025. One seat is for the remaining four-years of a six-year term. The term begins on July 1, 2019 and ends on June 30, 2023.

Persons interested in running for an Ingham ISD board seat must be at least 18 years of age, a registered voter, and a resident within one of the 12 local constituent districts. Interested candidates have a choice of either:

- Filing nomination petitions with a minimum of 40 (maximum 100) valid voter signatures of residents within the Ingham ISD service area *or*
- Paying a \$100 nonrefundable filing fee.

A completed Affidavit of Identity is due at the time of filing. The deadline to submit petitions or to pay the filing fee and submit the required affidavit is May 6, 2019.

The nomination petitions or the filing fee must be submitted directly to the Ingham County Clerk's Office, located in the Ingham County Courthouse on South Jefferson in Mason or in the Veterans Memorial Courthouse, 313 W. Kalamazoo Street in Lansing. Nomination petitions and Affidavits of Identity may be obtained from the Clerk's Office or from the Ingham ISD Superintendent's Office, 2630 West Howell Road, Mason.

Ingham ISD's board members are elected by the local district boards of education which include the following districts: Dansville, East Lansing, Haslett, Holt, Lansing, Leslie, Mason, Okemos, Stockbridge, Waverly, Webberville, and Williamston. Representatives from these local districts will convene at the June 5 election to cast votes which reflect resolutions passed by their boards of education for candidates running for the Ingham ISD board.
