How do concurrent enrollment partnerships benefit the students, instructors, and high school?

- Courses focus student learning on critical thinking and writing skills
- Students are evaluated with multiple and varied assessments
- Wilson Talent Center instructors are provided with ongoing professional development led by university faculty and staff
- Partnerships foster strong local networks among secondary and postsecondary educators
- College admissions officers now look for evidence of rigorous course work on students' high school transcripts
- Students earning concurrent enrollment credit may enjoy greater flexibility as full time college students by pursuing a second major or taking advantage of study abroad and/or internship opportunities
- Students are able to reduce their cost of a college education since tuition is cover by the Wilson Talent Center

How do I request my FSU college transcript?

Current students can login to the Ferris State University website, click on MyFSU and enter their User Name and Password. Click on the My Academics tab and then the Transcripts and Enrollment Verification link. This will open the National Student Clearinghouse where you can enter your online request for transcripts from Ferris State University.

Transcript fees: Transcripts are \$5.00 per copy. Online transcript ordering through the National Student Clearinghouse carries an additional per order processing charge of \$2.25 but gives the option of paying by credit card.
